Get The Most From Your Money

A piano's need for tuning and servicing are key to maintaining the level of performance and quality of sound that is expected by its owner. For example, tuning frequency can range from every month for a concert pianist to once a year for a piano that is only used a few month out of the year. Most piano owners will be fine with a tuning scheduled once or twice a year.

You can get the most for your money by choosing to schedule tunings wisely. For instance, to get the most economical tuning, you could choose to schedule your servicing at times when the humidity level is stabilizing. The climate of Maine has large humidity swings through the year, and humidity changes will usually cause a piano to go out of tune. But a tuning when these swings are stabilizing for a season will allow the piano to stay in tune longer.

Outdoor humidity levels in Maine begin to stabilize in June. So for summer this will usually be the most economical time to schedule a tuning. This June tuning may very well allow the piano to stay in tune until October.

Sometime in October or November we in Maine normally begin heating our homes which creates an artificial humidity level usually much drier than the humidity level outdoors. Late October or November then would be winter's most economical tuning time.

By choosing a well timed servicing schedule you can have your piano hold its tuning longer and save money... Call us for other tips to save you money and enhance the value of your piano.

Piano Categories and Sizes

Verticals (measured in height):

Upright	48" to 60"
Studio	43" to 47"
Console	40" to 43"
Spinet	36" to 39"

Grands (measured in length):

Concert	7' 6" to 9' 6"
Medium	5' 6" to 7' 6"
Small ("Baby")	4' 6" to 5' 6"

Note that sometimes categories sizes may overlap.
